Why fixing a leaky loo matters

How to detect a leaky toilet: the #LeakyLooChallenge

Toilet Paper Test

1. Place a square of toilet paper at the back of the toilet bowl.
2. Leave it overnight without flushing.
3. In the morning, check the paper. If it's wet, you've got a leak.



Dry = no leak



Wet = leaky

Leaky Loo Strips

Some water companies offer free leaky loo detection strips, to help you easily spot a leak. Check with your water company to see if they provide these strips and how you can use them.

Found a leaky loo? Fix it...

- **Check Your Water Company Services:** Many water companies in the UK offer free services to detect and even fix leaky loos. Check if your water company provides this service - typically, you can find this information on their website or in their FAQ section.
- **Find a Trusted Plumber:** If your water company doesn't offer this service, find a plumber who is trained to fix leaks safely and efficiently.
- **DIY Repairs:** Found a leak? Take the faulty parts to your local hardware store, and the staff can help you find replacements.
